Sports Journalism – New Continuing Education Workshop at FHWien der WKW

The new workshop "Sports Journalism" introduces the participants to the subject in theory and practice and imparts know-how with a hands-on mentality. The workshop will take place from July 8 to 13, 2019. Applications can be submitted until May 20.

Vienna, April 12, 2019 - Goals, meters and seconds — for many outsiders this is the world of sports journalists. But the subject matter goes much deeper, the demands on sports reporters are becoming more and more complex.

From theory to practice

In the compact workshop "Sports Journalism" (taught in German) at FHWien der WKW the participants learn in small groups the most important basics of the two areas TV/Video and Print/Online. The workshop offers a first theoretical overview: What prerequisites should you bring with you for a job in sports journalism? What are the special requirements? How rapidly is the world of sports reporting changing?

The focus, however, is on practice: from the meaningful storyteller to the appropriate writing style to the concise short commentary, all the essential elements of sports journalism are incorporated.

Dream job sports journalist

The aim of the workshop is to teach the participants the basic journalistic skills for working in a sports editorial office and to apply and refine them in various practical projects. The theoretical framework offers a general overview of the current challenges in the field of sports reporting as well as economic and legal framework conditions. First concrete tips for a successful entry into the field of sports journalism round off the seminar.

Further training in journalism
